In February 2010, Canada and the United States reached an agreement extending Canada's coverage under the WTO Government Procurement agreement to provinces. ***Washington businesses can now bid on an equal basis for Canadian government contracts at both the federal and provincial government levels.***

Canadian government procurement covered by the agreement was valued at **US \$86 billion** in 2010.

The Washington State Department of Commerce, the U.S. Commercial Service in Seattle, WA, the U.S. and Foreign Commercial Service in Vancouver, BC and Ottawa, ON, and Washington State General Administration are joining forces to help your business gain access to this opportunity.
